

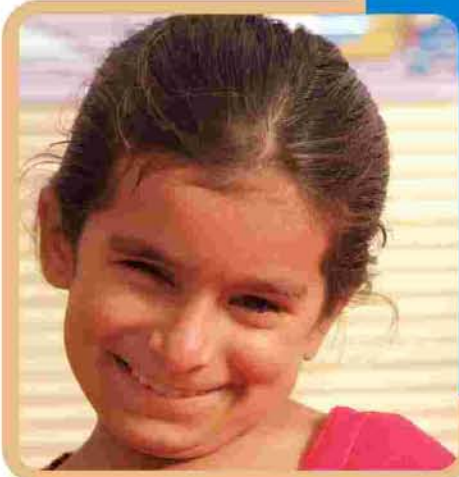

Changing lives

A new future for Sajida

9 year old Sajida lives in Qasba Colony in Karachi. When she was 6 she fell seriously ill but her father Khalil was away for work and visited only once in months. The child's illness was ignored until he came home and found her with very high fever. Khalil was horrified and rushed her to a government hospital where she was treated for fever but the long ignored disease had already badly affected her vision. The government hospital's doctors sent them to a private hospital for eye treatment where Sajida was under treatment for 2 years. To fund the treatment, Khalil was forced to borrow money from his relatives. Instead of her condition improving, it got worse to the extent that her left eye ball popped out of the socket. The private hospital washed their hands off her and referred her to LRBT Korangi. At LRBT, Sajida was given emergency treatment. She was operated on the same day and the doctors had to remove her left eye ball as the infection had spread and could have threatened her right eye. Keratoplasty (Corneal transplant) was performed on her right eye on 15th

September & she now has functioning vision.

Khalil, who in desperation had tried to commit suicide, is now overjoyed:

"It is difficult to believe that not so long ago her future prospects looked unlikely to amount to more than begging on the streets. Sajida can now lead a normal life. I am lost

for words and thank the doctors & staff of LRBT for their humanity, kindness & generosity. I'll pray for them till the day I die."

The need for a larger Operation Theatre has been felt for some time now as there is a long waiting list due to capacity limitations. Mr. Justice(R) Shamim Ahmed Sarwana kindly arranged a donation of Rs. 1.16million, Pakland Private Trust made a donation of Rs. 0.5 million and PEPCO a donation of Rs. 0.57 million. The new Operation Theatre has already been completed much ahead of its scheduled date of 30th October 2011 at an estimated cost of Rs. 2.65 million.

New hospitals. Odigram (SWAT):

After closure of Kalakalay hospital due to security reasons we were looking for a suitable site on the main road in the vicinity of Mingora. The notables of Odigram, a village 10 kilometers from Mingora agreed to donate 20 kanals of land (approximately 2.5 acres), which has now been officially transferred in LRBT's name.

The cost of the project which was estimated at Rs.59 million has increased

still need to find funds for the cost inflation. The Divisional Approving Committee headed by the Commissioner Malakand has accorded approval of PC-1 for the project on 29th of September 2011.

The process of pre-qualification of contractors has been completed and 10 contractors have been found eligible. A consultant is drawing up the bill of quantities after which the project will be put out to tender.

Partnership agreements

- The partnership between LRBT & the Govt. of Sindh has restored the

vision of 10,238 poor blind people in Sindh so far. This project in which the Government of Sindh has committed to provide Rs. 37.5 Million to LRBT for performing 18,750 surgeries is progressing

smoothly and shall conclude in November this year.

- An agreement for project titled 'LRBT Khanewal Hospital Expansion – Phase III' was signed between

LRBT & Mr. Muhammad Amin Nathani in July 2011, whereby he would fund Rs. 32.18 million during the period July 2011- July 2014. The project aims at construction of a new OPD complex and residences for doctors at the hospital in order to facilitate more patients & offer improved eye care benefits to the patients.

- In order to address the problem of cataracts and to reduce blindness amongst communities in Swat, an agreement was signed between Merlin in collaboration with Age International and LRBT in September 2011, whereby mobile eye camp services will be run in the catchments population of Union Council Teerat, Madyan and Behran under Age friendly component of health project. The mobile camps aim to provide community awareness, prevention and early recognition and primary treatment and referral of eye problems for all ages with special focus on cataract. The activity will start in the second week of October 2011.
