Social Health Worker, Qamar Jehan

- LRBT's 44 Millionth Patient!

LRBT recently treated its 44 millionth patient and has impacted the lives of millions more by enabling the treated to go back to leading fulfilling lives.



"Amma! Amma! cried out my youngest son as while turning in his sleep he fell off the bed and needed help to get up. Cries like these often left me shattered, fearing the worst. Three out of my eight children suffered from intense muscle weakness and

were handicapped. Being a lady health worker myself, I left no stone unturned trying to find a cure for the ailment but to no avail. All the doctors and hospitals turned us away saying there is no cure till my dearest youngest son succumbed to the disease. I felt like the world had ended when I lost my baby boy, but I picked myself up to take care of my family, only to lose my husband to grief a couple of weeks later." Recalls Qamar Jehan with tears in her eyes.

She was married when she was only 18 years old. Her husband, a rickshaw driver, was a family man and supported Qamar in pursuing a career. Being the only child, Qamar's mother came to live with her when her husband passed away.

Despite all innumerable difficulties Qamar remained strong. She married off her two daughters and once her sons found jobs they got married too and moved out. With families of their own, they did not contribute to the income, she and her husband ran the household paying the rent and utilities. There were days when she felt unable to face the day, her husband was her pillar of strength in those times. Her youngest son's health was steadily deteriorating too; she was being pulled in so many directions that she was at a loss of how to cope. Unfortunately, tragedy struck when her youngest son passed away three years ago, she and her husband were inconsolable. She had no choice but to bounce back but it was her husband who was so grief-stricken



that he gave up on life altogether and passed away within a month of his son's death.

Life just keeps on throwing curveballs for some people and Qamar's next one came when she started to have issues with her right eye.

At LRBT Korangi Hospital, Qamar underwent a thorough examination and was diagnosed with retinal detachment due to diabetes. She was given a date for surgery and assured that her treatment would be free, something Qamar couldn't quite believe.



The only consolation in her bleak situation was that her condition had been diagnosed properly and she was in capable hands, receiving top-class quality treatment for free. She had a micro incision vitrectomy surgery to reattach the retina. The surgery was successful and Qamar on her follow-up visit to LRBT expressed her heartfelt thanks saying, *"With life knocking me down every step of the way, coming to LRBT and being treated here was perhaps the only thing that kept me from collapsing under the sheer burden of my responsibilities. When life throws you down you have to hold on to every ray of hope and for me that was LRBT."*



LRBT supported Qamar Jehan during COVID-19 also. Her son-in-law lost his battle with cancer and she is now supporting her daughter and 5 grandchildren. LRBT gave her ration packs enabling her to support her family till the lockdown eased.

Help us change the lives of millions more like Qamar Jehan. Help us turn them into productive members for their families and society. Help us give them a bright future full of love, hope and cheer.

Partnership Agreements

LRBT gives credit to its partners for its success and is proud to work with them on ongoing projects:

Government of Sindh

Cataract surgeries under the project in all five Sindh Hospitals began in July 2019, following a grant of Rs. 70 million given by the Government of Sindh to LRBT to carry out sight restoring cataract surgeries on the poor and deserving patients living in the province. In the period January-June 2020, we were required to conduct 9853 surgeries but we could carry out 7181 surgeries as all hospital activities were suspended due to the prevailing pandemic. We are grateful to the Government of Sindh for its generous support.



Vision” campaign, which is a global effort emphasizing the need to increase children’s access to eye health continues to provide eye wear to children under this program. This is being implemented by LRBT at all the hospitals in its network.

During this quarter this year, we conducted OPD of 69,298 children of which 515 were refracted and 1,080 glasses are being provided to them.

Sightsavers



Under an agreement signed with Sightsavers, we were required to perform 5,850 cataract surgeries in the period January-June 2020. As the hospitals were closed due to the Government’s directive on elective surgeries, we were able to carry out 4,967 surgeries. We hope to meet the shortfall in the near future. The project life is three years.

Seeing is Believing program of Standard Chartered Bank in partnership with Sightsavers and LRBT, which included carrying out refraction, 25,300 cataract surgeries and minor surgeries over a period of 3½ years, came to a successful conclusion in March 2020. This program was launched in July 2016 at its hospitals at Mansehra and Swat. In order to support this project, LRBT was also provided with ophthalmic equipment. The 3850 surgeries’ target given for the first quarter was accomplished. These were additional surgeries which LRBT was requested to carry out in order to complete the task.



CBM International

LRBT is training 22 mid-level eye care personnel at our School of Paramedicines in collaboration with CBM.



These students are being trained for a two-year diploma course which will conclude in December 2020. We are thankful to CBM for the support being given to add more qualified mid-level health care professionals to meet our requirements.

A&A Company Formations DMCC - Dubai

A&A Company is financially supporting Avastin injections program for the poor and deserving patients who seek this treatment at LRBT. This one-year project commenced in June last year and a total of 4,243 injections were planned. So far, 3,542 patients have been administered these injections under this program at ten of our hospitals. 701 injections had to be deferred due to closure of all hospital activities under a Government directive. This target shall be accomplished in the next quarter.

FHF Cataract surgeries

Under an agreement inked with FHF, poor females employed in Agriculture and Cottage Industries in District Khanewal, Arifwala and Chiniot are referred to LRBT for sight restoring cataract surgeries. During the period under review, covering the last six months, a total of 336 sight restoring surgeries have been accomplished. This project is progressing

HCI MoUs



Under the two separate MoUs signed with HCI in October 2019, we were required to conduct cataract surgeries on 1,475 poor and deserving female adults at five designated LRBT Hospitals. The project was to conclude in May 2020 but as the hospitals were closed due to COVID-19, a balance of 475 surgeries is planned to be carried out in July to conclude the project. The second MoU provides funding to acquire four ophthalmic equipment required at four of our facilities. Of these, we have received two equipment while the third is under clearance and purchase order for the fourth equipment is in process. We are grateful to HCI for its continuous support.

Medical Relief International

In collaboration with MRI, an independent nonprofit organization existing under the charity laws of England and Wales based in Birmingham, UK, we have so far conducted 141 cataract surgeries on poor females at our Hospital in Mandra and another 46 sight restoring surgeries on children at our Tertiary Teaching Hospital Karachi during the period January 2020 to June 2020. We are thankful to MRI for this support.



i-Care Foundation

In order to reduce preventable blindness amongst the poor and needy males and females, i-Care Foundation inked an agreement with LRBT under which we conducted 192 Cataract Surgeries during the period January 2020 to June 2020. The hospital designated for this purpose is our facility at Lar Multan and Gambat.



Highlights from LRBT PAKISTAN

PSO donates OCT for LRBT Hospital Khanewal

We are extremely grateful to PSO for funding OCT for LRBT Hospital Khanewal.

OCT is specialized equipment through which doctors are able to see a cross section or 3D image of the retina and detect the early onset of a variety of eye conditions and eye diseases such as macular degeneration, glaucoma and diabetic retinopathy.

By acquiring an OCT Machine at our Khanewal Hospital, we will be able to serve patients coming to 3 other hospitals, namely Arifwala, Lar and Chiniot.

LRBT COVID-19 Response

Emergency: LRBT Hospitals were closed down in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. However, emergency was open in all our hospitals and patients were being treated under all safety protocols. Over 31,000 patients were treated in emergency during the lockdown.

A glimpse of some of the patients treated in Emergency during Covid-19 Lockdown

Gul Khan - 30 years old, Gul Khan hails from Quetta. He was working as a driver in a private company in Lahore. He had blurry vision since childhood, he was given Avastin injection at a



private hospital. Gul used up all his savings for that one injection. Due to the lockdown, he lost his job and at the same time urgently needed to get the second injection too. He heard about LRBT Quetta and was examined under all safety protocol and given the second Avastin injection free of cost.



Mai Sadoran - Is a 60 year old widow living in District Khairpur. She lives in a small cottage near an embankment of Indus River. She has 4 daughters and 5 sons. She used to make handmade brooms and sell to a neighborhood shop. Due to the lockdown, she lost her livelihood and at the same time started facing pain and watery eyes. She could not find treatment anywhere and came to LRBT Gambat as its emergency was operational. She was diagnosed with corneal abscess and given medication. At her follow-up her condition was much better and she profusely thanked the doctors.



Teleclinics

LRBT initiated Teleclinics whereby patients could call the helpline and state their ailment and were given a time for free online consultation with relevant ophthalmologist.



During the lockdown, a total of 733 patients were treated through LRBT Teleclinics.



Ration Distribution

LRBT contributed 10% of all digital collections during Ramazan for ration distribution to its most needy patients. A kind donor also joined in this initiative and enabled us to distribute ration packs to 800 plus people.



Pepsi

LRBT joined hands with Pepsi Co. for its Millions of Meals initiative in three locations: Tando Bago, Rashidabad and Gambat. Ration



packs were distributed to LRBT patients who were daily wage earners and had lost their livelihood due to the COVID-19 lockdown.

GLT Highlights

Food Pack Appeal

GLT supported LRBT's pledge to provide essential food items for those affected the most by the pandemic. Thus, an appeal was set up so that 20% of donations were allocated towards food packs. GLT supporters welcomed this decision to help the plight of the needy in unprecedented circumstances.

Komal Facebook Live

The Graham Layton Trust's Musical Events in March featuring Komal Rizvi, were postponed due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, which soon followed with a nationwide lockdown. However, GLT were able to host a virtual performance online via Facebook Live where Komal sang popular Pakistani and English songs. There were 13,000 views and the show helped provide light relief for people during a difficult time, while also drawing attention to GLT's ongoing work.



Congratulations on completing eye care training programs

LRBT strongly believes in training its doctors and paramedics so as to give the best quality care to our patients.

LRBT recognizes that eye care for our patients begins in the homes, streets and clinics of our communities. Eye health paramedics are there to provide care to patients without the need to go to hospitals. We believe that good patient care can only come with improving the skills of our workforce.

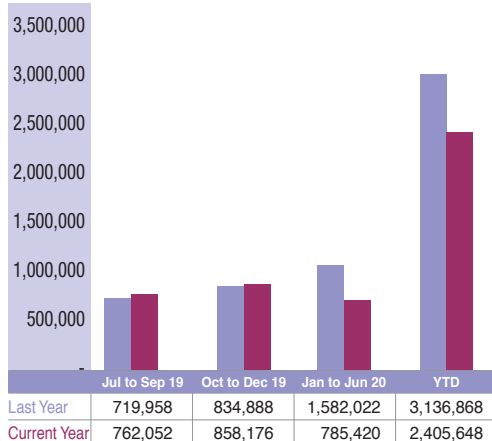

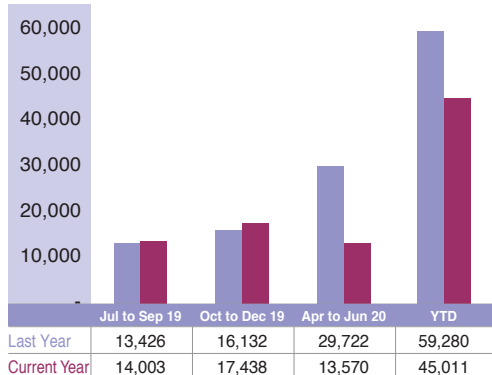

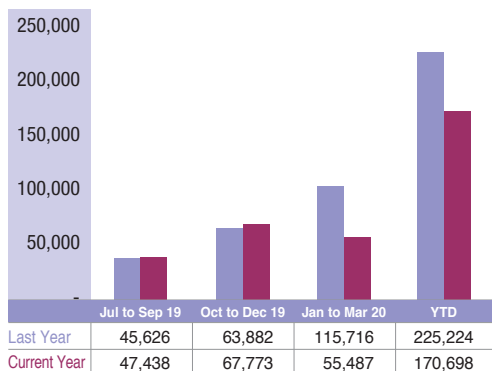

MINOR SURGERIES

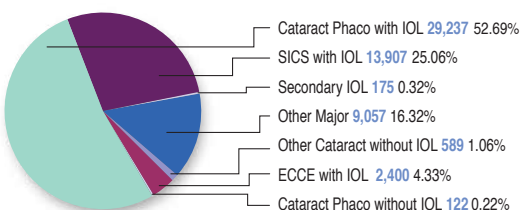

Eye Screening Camps

24 Eye Screening Camps were conducted at **Akora Khatak, Arifwala, Khanewal, Korangi, Lar Multan, Mandra, Quetta & Shahpur Saddar** in collaboration with Sight Savers International, Islamic Aid and K-Electric. A total of 5,104 patients were examined, out of which 3,330 were medicated, 2,547 refracted and 935 were referred to LRBT Hospitals for detailed examination and surgery.

Coping with the ever-growing patient volume

LRBT started off as a small mobile unit in Tando Bago over 34 years ago. Over the years, it has spread throughout the country with 19 hospitals and 58 eye care centers. The journey of growth and expansion continues.

Korangi:

The project was completed as planned on 15th March, 2020. However, due to the prevalence of the pandemic, furnishing and fixtures could not be deployed due to lockdown. These were carried out when suppliers made them available when there was lifting of restrictions on industries. The emergency staircase is being assembled. Ms. Khurshid Bhaimia, our longtime supporter has generously financed this project to house consultant clinics, the entire Pediatric Department and the low vision center with dedicated and comfortable waiting areas due to the increase in the number of patients who visit to receive specialized treatment. This has been constructed on the first floor of the Aisha Bhaimia Complex. The Bhaimia family had earlier sponsored the entire second floor of the Main Hospital building. Later, the family also financially supported the construction of a new section in which the Outpatient Department is located.

We are grateful to Ms. Khurshid Bhaimia for her continuous support to LRBT.

LRBT Corneal Bank

During 1st half, 101 corneal grafts were carried out at LRBT Hospitals.

LRBT Free Tertiary Eye Hospital Korangi Karachi performed 33 surgeries. We are grateful to **Karachi Airport Lions Eye Bank & Welfare Society** and **APPNA** for donating 30 corneas.

However, since April, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, availability of corneas has been impacted.
