FREE EYE CARE FOR THE POOR 

8 year old Ali - LRBT's 42 millionth patient!

LRBT recently treated its 42 millionth patient and has impacted the lives of millions more by enabling the treated to go back to leading fulfilling lives.



LRBT's 42nd million patient, Ali from Multan, is one of the 3 million children for whom LRBT is the only hope to see.

Two years ago, only 6 at the time, Ali lost his eyesight while playing cricket in

his neighborhood. Local doctors and home remedies worsened the case and eventually he lost his eyesight. He had to quit school as his other eye also started getting affected due to exertion. His father, Syed Ghulam, a daily wage earner, was devastated to see his son turning blind but was helpless as he could not afford corneal transplant advised by various ophthalmologists.

The only boy and youngest of five siblings, Ali was the apple of his parent's eye and loved by everyone for his bubbly personality, ready smile and cheerful disposition. After this incident, Ali underwent a drastic change, he stopped going outside to play and refused to even meet his friends. Despite their best attempts, his sisters could not cajole him to participate in any activity. He was usually found sitting alone in a corner somewhere, lost in

thought. He repeatedly asked his mother that would he remain blind for the rest of his life; his mother struggled to control her tears while she consoled her son, secretly hoping for a miracle. It broke their hearts that they could not provide a better life for their son.

LRBT emerged as a beacon of hope when Ali's uncle told them about LRBT free eye hospital and brought Ali to Karachi. His eye condition was alarming and LRBT doctors were doubtful of the surgery's absolute success, but Ali's long years ahead of him compelled them to take the risk. Ali's Keratoplasty was performed successfully and today he is able to see.

Syed Ghulam took a couple of days off from work to come see his son and accompanied him to his follow-up visits to the hospital, he



was overcome with emotion when the doctors assured him that Ali's eye was healing nicely and he should be able to travel to his hometown soon. He thanked the doctors and said, *"It is through Allah's mercy and the help of generous donors that we have institutions like LRBT who provide free quality eye care to people like us who do not have the means to afford treatment. Thank you for giving us the joy of seeing our son cured with a future full of possibilities."*

Coping with the ever-growing patient volume

LRBT started off as a small mobile unit in Tando Bago over 33 years ago. Over the years, it has spread throughout the country with 19 hospitals and 58 eye care centers. The journey of growth and expansion continues.

Korangi:

A project to house the consultant clinics and a pediatric wing with dedicated waiting areas was urgently needed due to increasing number of patients reporting at the Tertiary Facility to receive specialized treatment. This project was launched on 1st March, 2019 and is expected to be completed by the end of February next year. Concrete slab of the roof has been laid and electrical wiring is in progress presently. Ms. Khurshid Bhaimia, our longtime supporter is financing this project. The Bhaimia family had earlier sponsored the entire second floor of the main Hospital building. Later, the family financially supported the construction of a new section in which the new Outpatient Department is located.

Partnership Agreements

LRBT gives credit to its partners for its success and is proud to work with them in ongoing projects:

Government of Sindh

This fiscal year, a grant of Rs. 70 million from the Government of Sindh has been allocated to LRBT to carry out sight restoring cataract surgeries on the poor and deserving patients living in the province. These surgeries will be conducted in all the five Sindh Hospitals. We are grateful to Government of Sindh for their generous support.



Sightsavers



Under an agreement inked with Sightsavers, LRBT is conducting sight restoring cataract surgeries at four designated hospitals in our network. The project is spread over a period of three years. In the period under review, we carried out 1,590 cataract surgeries, according to schedule.

In a related arrangement, LRBT is required to conduct 1700 sight restoring cataract surgeries during the period January 2019 to December 2019. A total of 755 surgeries have been accomplished so far according to schedule.

Under the Seeing is Believing program of Standard Chartered Bank in partnership with Sightsavers, LRBT is required to carry out refraction, cataract and minor surgeries over a period of 3½ years. This program was launched in beginning July 2016 at its hospitals at Mansehra and Swat. In order to support this project, LRBT has also been provided with ophthalmic equipment. The surgeries' target set for the year 2019 is 6,600. In this quarter, we have been able to conduct 1,759 cataract surgeries.



Brien Holden Vision Institute



LRBT, as a partner in BHVI's "Our Children's Vision" campaign, which is a global effort emphasizing the need to increase children's access to eye health continues to provide eye wear to children under this program. This is being implemented by LRBT at all the hospitals in its network.

During this quarter this year, we conducted OPD of 67,069 children of which 607 were refracted and 472 glasses are being provided to them.

CBM International

Under an agreement with CBM, LRBT is required to carry out 3000 sight restoring cataract surgeries during this calendar year. Three designated hospitals, Tando Bago, Rashidabad and Gambat are hosting this activity. This project is progressing smoothly, according to schedule. In a related development, LRBT is also being supported by CBM to train 22 mid-level eye care personnel at our School of Paramedicine. These students are being trained for a two-year diploma course which will conclude in December 2020.



Medical Relief International

An MoU was inked with MRI, an independent nonprofit organization existing under the Charity Laws of England and Wales based in Birmingham, UK.



As required, we have so far conducted 155 cataract surgeries on poor females at our hospital in Mandra and another 46 sight restoring surgeries on children at our Tertiary Teaching Hospital, Multan Road, Lahore and Karachi. We hope to escalate the scale of work with this organization in future.

A&A Company Formations DMCC- Dubai

Under an understanding reached with A&A Company, all Avastin related activity in which this requires to be injected for some eye ailments, will be financed by the Company for poor and deserving patients only. This project began in June 2019 and shall conclude in May 2020. During the month of June, 355 poor patients received Avastin injections at ten of our designated hospitals. A total of 4,243 Avastin injections will be given over the project period.

We are grateful to A&A Company Formations-DMCC for their generous support.

FHF Cataract surgeries



Under an MoU signed with Fred Hollows Foundation (FHF), LRBT has been allocated 1,500 sight restoring cataract surgeries from FHF referred surgery patients, which comprise poor females employed in Cottage Industries in District Khanewal. During the period under review, a total of 300 surgeries have been accomplished. This project is progressing according to schedule.

Congratulations on completing eye care training programs

LRBT strongly believes in training its doctors and paramedics so as to give the best quality care to our patients.

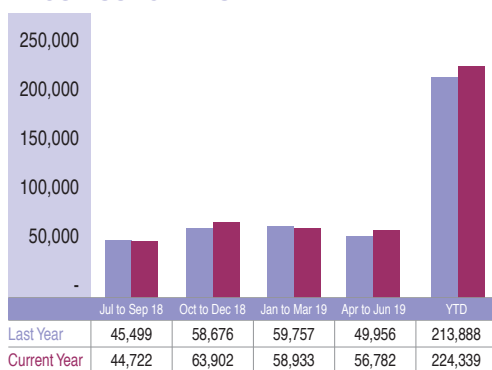

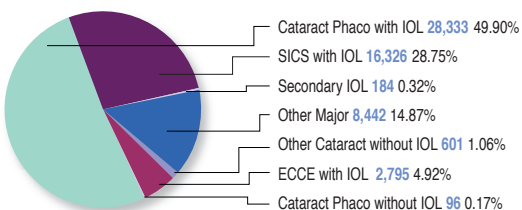

7 Eye Screening Camps were conducted at Akora Khattak, Korangi, Mandra, Quetta, Rashidabad and Shahpur in collaboration with Sightsavers, Lotte Chemical Pak. Ltd. & APPNA. A total of 1,504 patients were examined, out of which 1,201 were medicated, 471 refracted and 208 were referred to LRBT Hospitals for detailed examination and surgery.
